Sorors are provided with prescriptive curriculum guidance, based on their leadership level and life stage, while still providing the option to customize their own leadership pathway.

- 1. I am an undergraduate soror who was not accepted into the annual Leadership Fellows Program. Is it possible for me to seek an international office?
 - Yes, the Executive Leadership Certification is open to undergraduate and graduate sorors interested in seeking international office.
- 2. I am seeking international office in 2024 and I participated in Directorate Candidate Certification, do I need to take the Executive Leadership Certification in 2023?
 - Yes
- 3. May I take each course included in the Executive Leadership Certification program individually and still seek international office?

• No

4. What does it mean to have a "current" certification?

 A current certification means that the soror successfully completed a certification and it has yet to expire. For example, a potential candidate successfully completes Graduate Advisor Certification in April 2022. Her Graduate Advisor Certification does not expire until April 2025. Her certification is current from exactly April 2022 – April 2025 dates indicated on her certification transcript in the Members Only section of AKA1908.com.

5. Do I need to be present for the entire certification to receive the CEU credit?

- Yes, the University of Nevada Las Vegas (UNLV) requires at least 10 contact hours with each certification participant to receive credit.
- 6. Does the certification fee include the CEU credit certification?

 No, sorors wishing to receive CEU credit, will be provided with the opportunity to pay a \$35 administration fee to the University of Nevada
 Las Vegas for CEU credit.

Leadership Seminar

Workshop Selection

There are ten opportunities to attend workshops in addition to forums, networking sessions, certifications and specialized training opportunities. During the Leadership Seminar there will be a total of two workshop opportunities on Thursday, four workshop opportunities on Friday, and four workshop opportunities on Saturday.

- **PLAN** your travel accordingly to ensure that you leave ample time for potential travel delays, ground transportation from the airport to the hotel, and to complete registration prior to your first certification, specialized training, or workshop.
- **COMPLETE** any pre-Leadership Seminar requirements that are provided to you by certification or specialized training instructors (if applicable).
- **SELECT** workshop topics for Thursday, Friday, and Saturday that meet your development needs based on your specific pathway, chapter officer position, or areas of interest.
- **EXPLORE** a host of other planned activities, forums, luncheons, and tours.

BEFORE YOU CHOOSE

- **IDENTIFY** which pathway best aligns to your leadership journey in Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority and/or your personal or professional development needs.
- **READ** all descriptions carefully to determine if there are attendance requirements or if the content will meet your developmental needs.
- **REVIEW** the registration materials prior to accessing the online registration tool. Prior to going online to register, print or make a copy of the registration form (Page 30-31) and use it as a template to expedite your registration process.

- **CHOOSE** to register for:
 - All suggested courses aligned to a specific pathway or chapter officer position.
 - Mix and match workshops that align to your interest or personal and professional development needs across all pathways.
 - Review sample agendas for each Pathway and for specific chapter officers that are located in the Additional Resources section.
- **COORDINATE** with other chapter members to ensure coverage at as many workshops as possible. This will enable you to transfer a greater amount of information back to your chapter.
- **PLAN** to attend one of the networking sessions aligned to your profession or life stage. Undergraduate sorors are encouraged to attend a networking session aligned to your future profession.
- NOTE that all undergraduate sorors will be automatically registered to attend the Undergraduate Summit. In addition to the summit, undergraduates are encouraged to choose any workshops in Level 1: Pathway to Emerge or any other workshop aligned to their personal or professional development. Undergraduate Basilei and Membership Chairmen should plan to attend the Membership Experience if they have not attended one of the previous certification opportunities.

This certification workshop is designed to prepare sorors seeking to serve in an international office or regional position within the sorority. This training will provide an authentic, realistic, and objective perspective into the role, responsibilities, and skill set needed to serve at the highest level in the sorority. Content in this certification program will be presented at an advanced training level commensurate with the leadership expectations of those serving at the international level within the sorority. Continuing Education Units (CEU) available for those who successfully complete certification.

Membership Experience Certification July 13 - Option 1

This one day certification workshop is designed to certify chapters in the Membership Experience and provide them with the tools and guidelines necessary for this transformational process for candidates and sorors. This training will ensure attendees are prepared to deliver the material uniformly. For a chapter to be certified, the Basileus, Membership Chairman, and Graduate Advisor (for undergraduate chapters) must be certified.

Membership Experience Certification Julv 14 - Option 2

This certification workshop is designed to certify chapters in the Membership Experience and provide them with the tools and guidelines necessary for this transformational process for candidates and sorors. This training will ensure attendees are prepared to deliver the material uniformly. For a chapter to be certified, the Basileus, Membership Chairman, and Graduate Advisor (for undergraduate chapters) must be certified at the time of the Membership Experience.

Chapter Basileus Certification

The training will include tools, techniques, and resources for new, aspiring, and continuing Chapter Basilei. Content includes chapter operations/ parliamentary procedures/governing documents, membership, rituals, financial fundamentals, technology, strengthening our sisterhood. protocol, communications, and risk management. Continuing Education Units (CEU) available for those who successfully complete certification.

Evaluations and Investigations Training

This training will provide those sorors who have been appointed to regional investigations teams with the tools to conduct and provide prompt, fair, and objective investigations of alleged hazing and non-hazing incidents. The focuses will be on PC preserving our identity and fostering our principles. This training will implement a methodology of proper fact-finding review using The Investigation Guide and other documents, by applying skilled interviewing techniques and writing clear and concise investigation reports.
