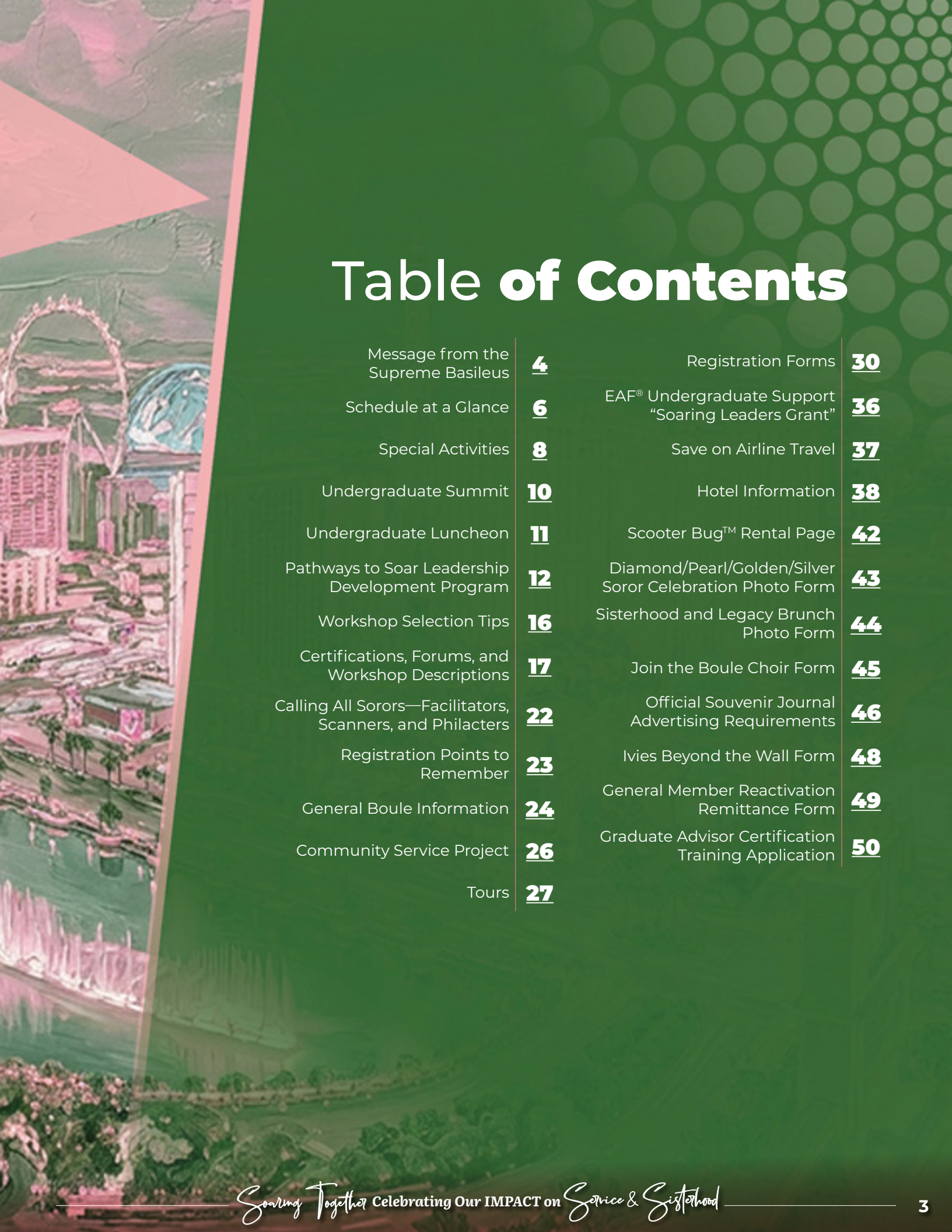


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Message from the Supreme Basileus

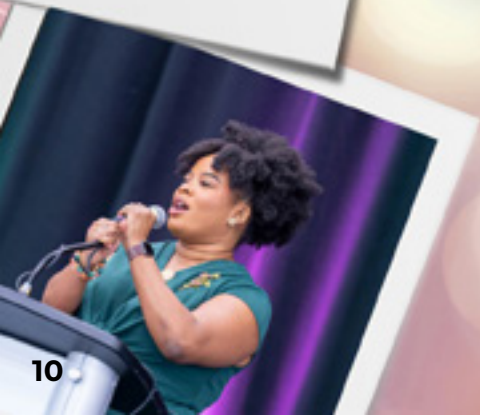

Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated® 2022 – 2026 International Leadership Development Program, **PATHWAYS TO SOAR**, is a modern, interactive, and high-impact approach to developing Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority's current and future leaders. The program consists of five Pathways designed to cultivate, empower, nurture, and support undergraduate and graduate sorors at every leadership level and life stage. Each Pathway and its corresponding curriculum are designed to assist sorors in recognizing and elevating their own leadership potential, while focusing on their

professional and personal growth and their physical and mental well-being. Sorors are provided with prescriptive curriculum guidance, based on their leadership level and life stage, while still providing the option to customize their own leadership pathway.

PATHWAYS TO SOAR endeavors to cultivate Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority leaders who are sisterly, empathetic, mission driven, critical thinkers, problem solvers, and innovative visionaries who possess the knowledge to thrive at home, at work, and in AKA®.

FAQ:

- I am an undergraduate soror who was not accepted into the annual Leadership Fellows Program. Is it possible for me to seek an international office?**
 - Yes, regardless of participation in the annual Leadership Fellows Program, it is possible for you to seek an international office by completing the Executive Leadership Certification which is open to both undergraduate and graduate sorors.
- I am seeking an international office in 2026, and I participated in Directorate Candidate Certification between 2018 - 2022. Do I need to take the Executive Leadership Certification to seek international office in 2026?**
 - Yes
- May I take each course included in the Executive Leadership Certification program individually and still seek international office?**
 - No
- What does it mean to have a "current" certification?**
 - A current certification means the soror successfully completed certification training and it has yet to expire. For example, a potential candidate successfully completes Graduate Advisor Certification in April 2024. The Graduate Advisor Certification does not expire until December 2027. The certification is current from the exact dates (April 2024 – December 2027) indicated on the certification transcript in the Members Only section of AKA1908.com.
- Do I need to be present for the entire certification to receive the CEU credit?**
 - Yes.

WORKSHOP SELECTION

Tips

There are three time slots to attend workshops in addition to forums and certifications.

- **PLAN** travel accordingly to ensure you leave ample time for potential travel delays, ground transportation from the airport to the hotel, and to complete registration prior to your first certification or workshop.
- **COMPLETE** any pre-Boule requirements provided to you by certification instructors (if applicable).
- ***SELECT** workshops that meet your development needs based on your specific pathway, chapter, officer position, or areas of interest.

BEFORE YOU CHOOSE

- **IDENTIFY** which Pathway best aligns to your leadership journey in Alpha Kappa Alpha, Sorority.
- **READ** all descriptions carefully to determine if there are attendance requirements or if the content will meet your developmental needs.
- **REVIEW** the registration materials prior to accessing the online registration. Prior to going online to register, print or make a copy of the registration form ([pages 32-33](#)) and use it as a template to expedite your registration process.
- **COORDINATE** with other chapter members to ensure coverage in as many workshops as possible. This will enable you to transfer a greater amount of information back to your chapter.
- ***NOTE:** all undergraduate sorors will be automatically registered to attend the Undergraduate Summit and cannot select certifications, workshops, or forums.

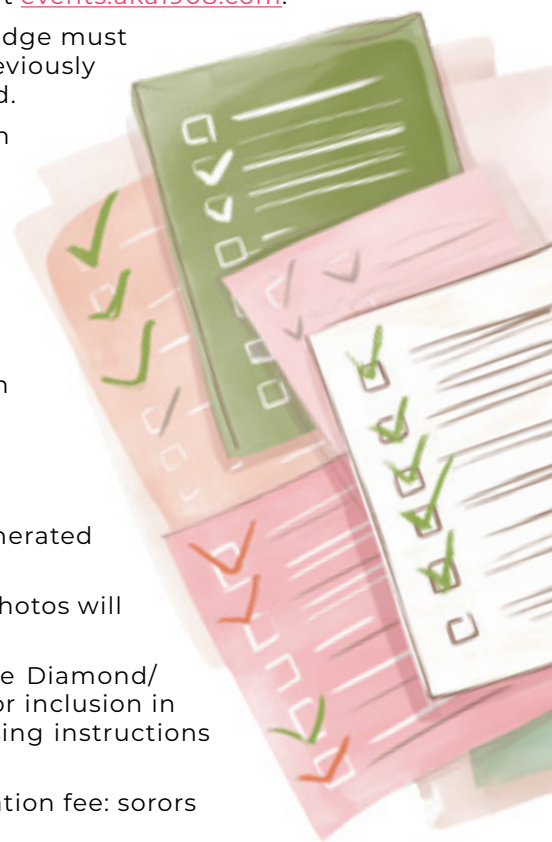

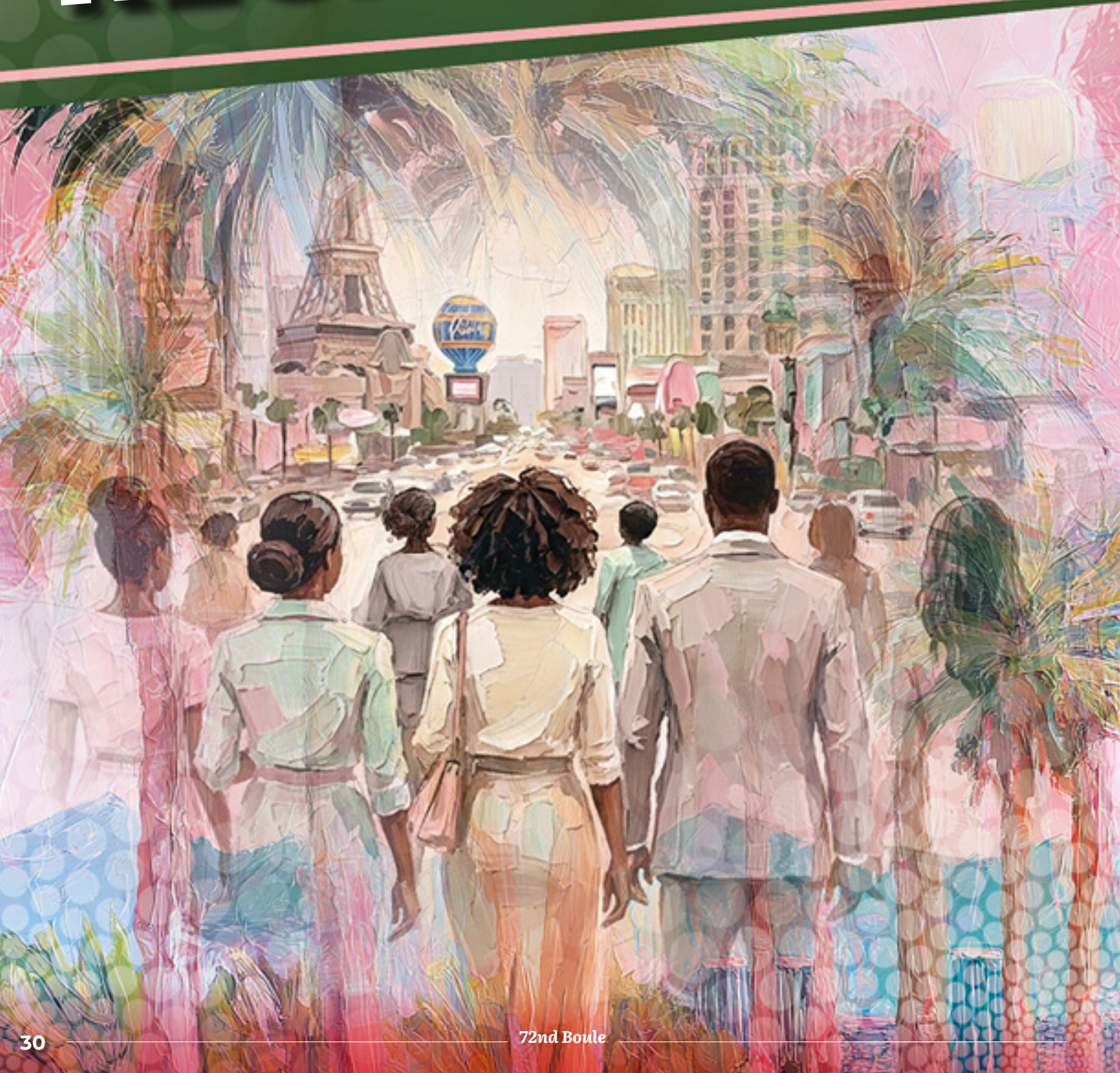

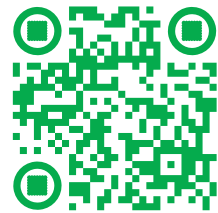
